Addressing the Circumstance of Students in Quarantine During Exam Periods Due to COVID-19 – 2021-2022 Spring Semester

Dear all,

Students who got sick with COVID-19, and as a result missed an exam during the time that they were in quarantine, will be eligible to take their exams the next time that the exam of that course is offered, but only if they present a confirmation of a positive COVID-19 test result (either PCR or institutional antigen test only) and quarantine instructions from the Ministry of Health. An assessment of eligibility for taking an additional exam will be conducted by Undergraduate Studies. You are to submit your request on the Undergraduate Studies website in accordance with the posted deadlines. In addition, students who meet the aforementioned criteria will be able to continue with their program of study without completing the prerequisite course exam. However, it is important to note that prerequisites are crucial, and we recommend that students do not rush to enroll in next course in the sequence without a full and in-depth understanding of the material taught in the prerequisite course.

In order to address unique and individual cases, the Dean of Undergraduate Studies will establish an Exceptions Committee, which he will lead and which will include the participation of the Chairperson of Technion Student Association. The committee will discuss various cases, such as students' final grade for their degree or concerns about a delay in graduating, courses that are only offered once a year and are the foundation for a long sequence of courses, courses with a large number of students (e.g., 10 or higher) who became ill with COVID-19 and needed to be in quarantine, etc. Instructions for contacting the committee will be published at a later date.

Please take good care of your health and the health of those around you. If you have any COVID-19 symptoms or suspect that you have been exposed, please take an institutional COVID-19 test, follow the instructions, and keep the confirmation of your test result.
